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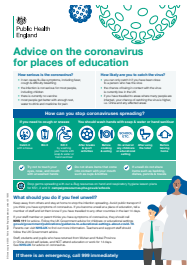

This week Tuff tray activities have included coloured pasta, weighing scales and different sized pots and scoops for early maths development. The

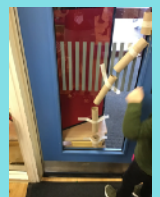
children have been sorting, looking at 'more' and 'less' and 'big' and 'little'. They have also had access to a wide range of natural materials which encourage

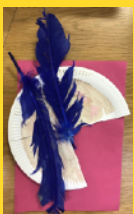
Bumbles Report - Debbie Torr

During STEM this week Sarah and the children explored gravity and why things drop to the ground. They engineered 'runs' using cardboard tubes which they stuck on the doors at various angles and used pom pom's to test how they affected gravity. The children discovered that using different sized Pom pom's and changing the angle of their tubes changed how fast they dropped to the ground.
